## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Criminal Mischief**

**Date: 09.01.15**

**Time: 0830 hours**

**Location: 100 blk West Bitters Road**

An officer was dispatched to contact a SAWS security staff officer at the above listed location. The security officer showed the officer two separate sections of chain link fencing that had been cut with what appeared to be a bolt cutter, allowing entry into the secured property. The property contains several different pumps and generators owned by SAWS. One of these pumps is located on the South East corner of the property. There is a vacant Church's chicken building located on the other side of the fence. The pump is enclosed with a second wrought iron fence with a single gate entry. The gate is secure with a pad lock attached to two pieces of chain link that were welded onto the fence. One of these links was also cut with a bolt cutter. There were no other signs of theft or damage. The security officer believed the fences were cut as a dry run by the unknown suspect(s) to come back and steal copper wiring from the pump station. This case is under investigation.

**Offense: Theft of a Vehicle**

**Date: 09.02.15**

**Time: 1635 hours**

**Location: 15600 blk San Pedro**

The manager of a local car rental store contacted City Hall to report a car that was rented and not returned. An officer responded to the business and contacted the manager. He stated that two customers had entered the store to rent a car on 07/23/2015. According to the manager, the

customer had sustained damage to his vehicle and was in need of a rental while his vehicle was being repaired. The male customer did not have a credit card so his girlfriend used her credit card to secure the vehicle. The male's insurance company was to pay the rental rate while his car was being repaired. On 08/07/2015, the original rented vehicle, a white Chrysler 200, was returned and a 2015 red Volkswagon Jetta was issued as a replacement vehicle. On 08/18/2015, the customer's vehicle was completed at the body shop. According to the manager, the body shop called to report the completion. The manager stated that the customer showed up at the body shop and picked up his vehicle, but did not leave the Jetta at the location. The manager has made several attempts to contact the customer but could he could never reach him. The location of the vehicle is unknown and the vehicle was never returned so it was reported as a stolen vehicle.

**Offense: Violation of State Liquor Laws**

**Date: 09.03.15**

**Time: 2113 hours**

**Location: 15300 blk San Pedro**

An officer was traveling southbound in the 15300 Block of San Pedro Ave at the Brook Hollow intersection when he observed a male subject with a beer bottle in his hand while operating a motor vehicle. The officer initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle. The officer made contact with the male driver who provided the officer with his Mexico ID card. The driver stated that he did not have a driver's license and has only been residing in San Antonio for a short time. The officer had the driver exit his vehicle so that he could conduct a Probable Cause search inside the vehicle for other open alcohol containers. The officer located the 12 ounce Bud Light beer bottle on the floorboard area on the passenger side. The beer bottle was 3/4 empty and the remaining liquid was poured out. The bottle was later disposed of in the dumpster at the police station. The driver admitted the beer bottle was his and that he had just opened it while driving home after getting off of work. The driver said that he had not consumed any other alcoholic beverages prior to this one. The officer conducted a field sobriety test to ensure the driver was not intoxicated. The officer did not suspect the driver to be intoxicated. The driver was cited and a friend of his arrived to take custody of the vehicle.

**Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle**

**Date: 09.05.15**

**Time: 1805 hours**

**Location: 14100 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to a local business for a vehicle burglary. Upon arrival the officer made contact with the victim. The victim told the officer he had arrived at the location at approximately 1730 hours and went inside with his wife. When he returned to his vehicle at approximately 1800 hours he discovered that the passenger rear window on his truck had been broken and a leather bag was removed from the passenger rear floorboard. The officer processed the passenger rear door for latent prints and was able to develop and pull four cards. The officer was able to speak with an employee at the location who said that a new camera system was just installed and a copy of any footage picked up on the cameras would be forwarded to the officer

next week. The employee contacted a manager at the location who was able to view the footage and learned that the crime occurred at approximately 1755 hours and the actor(s) arrived in a white in color Suburban. This case is under investigation.
