Calls of Interest

Offense: Burglary of a Building

Date: 09.01.13

Time: 2350 hours

Location: 15700 blk San Pedro

While doing a business check, an officer found a door to a business with the glass broken out. There was glass lying inside and outside of the door frame. The officer notified dispatch and requested a cover officer. While waiting, the officer checked the exterior of the building and found a partially open rear door. When the second officer arrived, the building was cleared. No suspects were discovered inside the building. While clearing the building, the officer observed several items which had been damaged. These items included the cash register, store safe, and a metal lock box located in the building. The lock box contained the numerical stickers used for inspection certificates. The officer called the store manager and asked him to come to the location. While waiting for the manager, the officer processed the crime scene. When the manager arrived, it was determined that the burglar had not gained entry into the safe. The register did not have any money inside, and the lock box with the state inspection stickers did not have any valid stickers inside. According to the manager, he did not notice any missing items, just the significant damage done to the items mentioned. The manager thought the burglary could have been committed by a terminated employee. This case is under investigation.

Offense: Theft \$50-\$500

Time: 1407 hours

Location: 15700 blk San Pedro

A citizen called the city cell phone to report a theft. The officer arrived and contacted the female caller. The female told the officer she came outside and attempted to drive off when she heard a noise coming from the rear of her truck. The female then discovered her spare tire was missing and the locking mechanism was hanging from the bottom of her truck. She had arrived at the gym at approximately 1240 hours and returned to her truck at approximately 1400 hours. The officer asked if her spare tire was on her truck prior to her arrival and she stated "yes." The officer observed the cable hanging from her truck with no spare tire. The female was given a case number for her insurance company.

Offense: Burglary of a Building

Date: 09.05.13

Time: 0337 hours

Location: 14800 blk San Pedro

Officers were dispatched to a local eye care business for a burglar alarm with glass breakage. Officers arrived within three minutes of being dispatched. Officer 2 observed the front entry door of the business was slightly ajar. Entry had been made by prying open the door. Officer 1 checked the rear parking lot, but no vehicles were observed and the rear doors appeared secure. The officers entered the business and found several plastic rods, glass, and eyewear frames on the showroom floor. The plastic rods were displays that had been pulled from the wall. The glass on the floor was from a display case. Officers moved past the showroom and cleared the rest of the building, which looked undisturbed. The officers called for a manager come to the business. The manager arrived shortly thereafter. According to manager's inventory, approximately 80 - 100 eyewear frames had been stolen from the display wall. The value of the frames ranges from \$50-\$100. The manager provided the officers with a hand written list which contained the various name brands of the eyewear frames which had been stolen. The manager did not have any suspects in mind. The officers processed the crime scene and gather evidence from the scene. This case is under investigation.

Offense: Recovered Stolen Property

Location: 13800 blk San Pedro

A business owner called City Hall and reported he had located a cash register in a ditch north of the business. Upon arrival, the officer retrieved the cash register and located a business receipt in the drawer bearing the name EL JALISCO and showing a phone number. The officer contacted the number and was able to speak with an employee at the location who said there was not a manager available at that time. The employee confirmed there had been a burglary at the restaurant but did not have any further information. The officer contacted SAPD North Property Crimes and spoke with the on call investigator. The investigator was able to research the address and located the offense report. The investigator said he would contact the victim and advise them to pick up the item at the HCVPD. A short time later the restaurant owner arrived at HCVPD and the cash register was released to him.
