Offense: Assist other Agency

An officer was dispatched to assist HPPD with a vehicle burglary where the actor was still in the area. Dispatch provided information on the actor's location and description. The HCV officer found the actor crossing El Cerrito, between Meadowbrook Drive and Fleetwood Drive. The actor saw the officer and began running east through a wooded area between houses. The actor was wearing a t-shirt with gray shorts and carrying a black backpack. The actor jumped fences, attempting to avoid capture. The officer lost sight of him momentarily and caught up with him again between two houses in the 200 block of Donella Drive. At that point, the actor had removed his t-shirt and was now topless. The officer ordered the actor to the ground but the actor saw the officer and ran. The actor jumped the fence in the 200 block of Donella Drive then jumped the back fence into another yard on Great Wood. The actor jumped the front fence of the house on Great Wood where he again ran into a wooded area headed southwest. The actor was no longer carrying the backpack. The officer lost sight of the actor as he ran into the wooded area. A few minutes later, the officer heard on the radio that the actor was captured by HPPD officers at the corner of Sequoia Drive and Meadowbrook Drive. The HCV officer went to the house where the actor jumped the fence on Great Wood to look for the backpack. The male resident allowed the officer to look in his backyard but it was not found. The resident said he saw the actor come through his yard. The resident also said the actor broke some tines off his fence as the actor jumped the fence. The resident told the officer that the actor was not carrying a backpack when he saw the actor. The officer went to the house directly behind his where the actor had jumped the fence to avoid the officer. The resident at allowed the officer to check her backyard for the backpack. The officer found the black backpack close to the back fence in her yard. The officer notified HPPD and stood by for them to make location. HPPD arrived and the scene was turned over to them. The officer resumed patrol.
