### **Offense: Burglary of a Building**

An officer was dispatched to a medical office for an alarm call with glass breakage. The officer discovered a window on the north side of the building had been broken out by an unknown individual without the effective consent of the property manager. Officers cleared the building and no one was found inside. The property manager for the business was contacted and he went to the location.
