Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle

A resident called to report a vehicle burglary. Two officers went to the location. The resident reported that her vehicle had been broken into and had the suspect on surveillance camera. The resident reported that this has happened a few times in the past. The resident has recently placed cameras around the property and captured suspect in action. An officer watched the video and observed a male wearing a long sleeve button up shirt, blue jeans, light in color belt and possibly two toned shoes walk up to the listed vehicle and opens the front passenger side door. The officer resumed patrol.
