**Offense: Assist other Agency**

An officer received a dispatch in reference to two (2) suspicious males entering vehicles at a local car lot. The officer made contact with a male subject walking off one of the lots. The male stated he and his wife had just stopped by to look at a truck. The officer informed the male why he had been dispatched. The male stated that prior to the officer's arrival, two males were on the car lot looking at vehicles. The male further stated that he heard a vehicle door opening and closing. The two males departed in a green Range Rover. The officer obtained information from the male and resumed normal patrol. No further action was taken.
