Offense: Credit Card Abuse

Date: 09.23.16

Time: 1030 hours

Location: 100 blk Tomahawk Trail

A resident came to the police department and requested a police report be made. The resident reported that on or about 09/15/16 he received two Chase Freedom Unlimited credit cards in the mail that he had not requested. The first card was in his name. The second card had the same account number, but was in the name of another person. The resident stated he did not know anyone by that name and did not approve a credit card in neither his own name, nor that of the other person. The resident said he went to Chase Bank and notified them about the unauthorized cards. Chase Bank cancelled the cards and a fraud alert was placed on his name by the credit bureau.

Offense: Disturbance

Location: 15800 blk San Pedro

Officers were dispatched to the 14800 block of San Pedro for a report of a verbal argument between a male and female. Dispatch relayed that a female, and a male wearing a maroon shirt, were arguing near a white Mitsubishi car. Dispatch further relayed that the male threw a beer can at the female. Based on the male throwing the can at the female officers traveled to the

location while using the vehicle's emergency equipment. Upon arrival an officer observed a small white Mitsubishi car leaving the location and traveling eastbound across the Winding Way bridge. The officer was able to catch up with the vehicle and a traffic stop was initiated. Contact was made with the female driver and the male passenger. The parties were separated, identified, and it was determined that the parties were having a verbal dispute. Both individuals related that no beer can had been thrown. It appeared that both parties had calmed down and no offense had taken place. All parties released at the scene.

An officer observed a vehicle travelling in the 500 blk of W. Bitters Rd with a head lamp out. The officer conducted a traffic stop in the 13000 blk of Walker Ranch. The officer contacted the female driver and informed her about the head lamp. A computer check showed the driver to have an active warrant for Theft \$50-\$500 issued by Bexar County. Relatives of the driver were contacted and asked to come to the location to take custody of a three year old child in the car. After the relatives arrived, the child and vehicle were released to them. The driver was taken into custody and booked into jail.

Offense: Fraudulent Use of Identifying Information

Location: 100 blk Blackhawk Trail

An officer stopped a vehicle when the occupants were seen looking into a mail box in the 100 block of Winding Way. The officer was familiar with the vehicles that are kept at that residence and that vehicle was not a vehicle that belonged to that location. The officer also knew that we have had recent mail thefts in the area. A computer check of the license plate had a warrant attached to it. The officer requested a cover unit and made contact with the driver. The driver stated that he did not have his driver's license on him, when asked, but was able to provide the officer with his name, DOB and social security number. The officer asked the driver to exit the vehicle and stand by his trunk, while the officer did a computer check. Both the driver and female passenger had active warrants. Both subjects were taken into custody. The officer asked both the occupants if they were at the mailbox at the residence on Winding Way. They both stated that they were. The male stated that he was playing a prank on someone he knew from that residence. The officer walked around to the passenger side of the vehicle and noticed a newly issued Hill Country Village Residents Directory on the floorboard in plain view. The officer retrieved the directory and asked the female if she removed the directory from the mail box, to which she replied that she had. The officer asked the female if that was the only item that she removed from the mailbox and she stated that it was. While beginning an inventory of the vehicle prior to impounding, the officer opened the center console between the seats and discovered a blue nylon bag containing credit cards and a Texas Driver's License that did not belong to either occupant of the vehicle. The officer also discovered checks, inside of the wallet belonging to the male, that were issued in another name. The officer continued to inventory the

vehicle and discovered several credit cards and another driver's license inside of the door pocket of the driver's door. These items did not belong to either occupant of the vehicle. The vehicle contained several bags, backpacks, suitcases and purses. The officer looked inside the pink purse that the female stated was hers and discovered several more credit cards, checks, and a passport. None of the items belonged to her. Numerous syringes were found throughout the vehicle and inside of the purse belonging to the female. Upon completion of the inventory, a total of 48 various credit cards, 9 identification cards, 2 United States Passports, 23 Frost Bank checks (some filled in and signed) and 2 Texas DPS temporary permits. All the items were seized as evidence. Also seized was a large amount (suitcase and backpacks full) of mail that did not belong to the male or female. The officer removed and seized a printer and a notebook containing several copies of US currency which appeared to be an attempt to counterfeit the dollar bills. Two laptop computers, 1 paper cutter, 9 cell phones (varying conditions), flash drive, printing ink and supplies, 16 gift cards and 11 miscellaneous cards issued to person(s) other than them. The vehicle was impounded and both were booked into jail.
