Offense: Abandoned Vehicle

An officer received a call from a resident who reported there was an abandoned vehicle parked in the middle of the road in the 100 blk of South Tower. An officer was dispatched to a local business for a theft report. The male victim reported that at approximately 1600 hours he locked his personal belongings in locker located in the upstairs men's locker room, with a lock owned by him. When he returned at approximately 1745 hours he observed that his personal lock was missing and his locker door was open. The male reported that his backpack which contained his wallet and cell phone was missing. The officer checked the locker room and was unable to locate his lock. The officer told the male to contact his credit card companies to report the cards as stolen and to ascertain if any fraudulent charges had been made on the accounts. The credit card companies said that there were multiple fraudulent charges made on both of the credit cards. This case is under investigation.
