## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Shots Fired**

**Date: 09.23.13**

**Time: 2016 hours**

**Location: Axis Trail @ Hidden View**

Officers were dispatched to check for three shots fired in the area. Officers checked the area but did not locate anyone in distress. An officer spoke with two different residents that had been walking the area for a while, but neither of these residents had heard any gunshots. A third resident said he heard what he thought was an explosion. After checking the area numerous times and not finding anything, the officers resumed patrol.

### **Offense: Wanted Person**

**Location: San Pedro @ Brook Hollow**

A vehicle was observed sitting at the traffic light and not proceeding through the green light when it had cycle a couple of times. Officers pulled behind the vehicle and activated the emergency lighting equipment of the patrol cars. Contact was made with the male driver who was passed out behind the wheel. Officers knocked on the window for several seconds before the male woke up and opened the door. The second officer removed the vehicle keys through the passenger door to ensure the vehicle wasn't driven away. The officer asked the driver why he was sleeping in the road. The male said he was just tired. The officer did not detect any odor of an alcoholic beverage on or about the male or the vehicle. A computer check showed four active warrants for male. Three of the warrants were from the San Antonio Municipal Court. The fourth warrant was issued out of Bexar County Court 2. All of the warrants were verified and confirmed as active. The male was placed under arrest and transported to the City Magistrate for booking. The male's parents lived close by so the vehicle was released to the mother.

**Offense: Information****Date: 09.27.13****Time: 0001 hours****Location: NE Loop 410 @ San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to NE Loop 410 and San Pedro to take custody of a HCV officer's weapon. The off duty officer had been involved in a motorcycle accident where she had struck a piece of furniture in the middle of the road. When the officer arrived, the off duty officer had already been transported to University Hospital by EMS. The officer took custody of the weapon from SAPD and secured the weapon at HCVPD. It was later learned that the off duty officer had not been seriously injured.

**Offense: Evading Arrest****Date: 09.27.13****Time: 0408 hours****Location: 14300 blk San Pedro**

An officer saw a Toyota Tundra traveling southbound on the US Hwy 281 N. access road. The vehicle pulled into a vacant lot between two closed businesses. The vehicle backed onto the access road and proceeded to drive northbound in the southbound lane, back to the parking lot of an adjacent business where the officer was parked. As vehicle entered the parking lot, the officer turned on the patrol car headlights, activated the emergency lights and began to approach the truck. The driver circled the lot and started to speed out of the parking lot, squealing his tires. The vehicle proceeded southbound on US Hwy 281 at a very high rate of speed. The officer continued to follow briefly reaching high speeds. The officer followed as the vehicle exited at Sunset Road. The male driver subsequently lost control of the truck and crashed into a utility pole in front of 8211 US Hwy 281N. The driver exited the vehicle under his own power and was taken into custody. Other officers arrived on scene to provide assistance. The male was advised of his Miranda Rights and placed in the back of the patrol vehicle. The male agreed to answer the officer's questions. When asked why he evaded, the male stated his only reason was stupidity. The male acknowledged seeing the patrol vehicle when he pulled into the parking lot and also acknowledged observing the red and blue emergency lights on the vehicle, but still did not want to stop. The male also stated, had he not hit the utility pole, his intention would have been to continue to Evade Arrest. EMS treated the driver for minor injuries. The male was then booked into jail.
