Offense: Forgery

Date: 09.27.12

Time: 1330 hours

Location: 14300 blk San Pedro

An officer was dispatched to a local bank for a Forgery report with the suspect still at the location. The suspect was at the bank attempting to cash a stolen check. The officer arrived and contacted the manager who explained the situation. A bank teller had noticed the account holder's signature did not match the one on the suspected check and called the account holder directly. The owner said the check was not authorized and said he was on his way to the bank. The teller showed the officer the check and turned it over to the officer. The officer contacted the suspect and asked her what happened. She told the officer that her boyfriend had sent her into the bank to cash the check. The boyfriend was nowhere to be found and seemed to have left his girlfriend holding the bag. The account holder arrived at the bank and confirmed the check was his. The account holder told the officer he had not authorized anyone to use that check. The officer took the female into custody at that time. The female was handcuffed in front because she was pregnant. The female was read her Miranda Rights and placed into a patrol car. The account holder intended to follow through with prosecution and filled out the necessary forms. The female was taken to the police department for processing and then she was booked into jail.

A business owner called to report a suspicious male hiding in the bushes. An officer arrived at the business and made contact with one of the employee's. She told the officer there was someone hiding in the bushes between two restaurants. The officer drove to the area and saw two males. When they saw the officer, one of the males walked off and the other male walked toward the officer. The officer asked him what they were doing there and the male said they were just resting. The officer asked him for his identification and he produced an identification card from a homeless shelter. The computer system showed he had a warrant out of Florida. Florida would not extradite the male unless he was within that state. The officer told the male he and his friend could not be sleeping or resting in the bushes and if he did not have any business there, he needed to leave. The male left the location as directed.

While an HCV officer was off duty, she observed a male run from the garden center of a WalMart. The officer then observed the male hit and pull away from a WalMart employee. The male began to flee from the employee and hid behind a parked vehicle in a Taco Bell parking lot, next to the WalMart. The officer saw a uniformed deputy chasing the suspect from a distance. The HCV officer's brother was driving and was told by the HCV officer to head in the same direction the suspect had gone. The HCV officer exited the vehicle and chased the suspect. The HCV officer caught the suspect and placed him on the ground. The suspect was ordered to put his arms behind his back and not move. The HCV officer told her brother to get the deputy and tell him where she was. At that time, another off duty officer observed the HCV officer holding the suspect down and assisted until the uniformed deputy arrived. The deputy took custody of the suspect from the off duty officers. The HCV officer reported the incident to her supervisor.
