Officers were dispatched to Paso Del Norte and San Pedro for a down power line. Upon arrival, it was discovered that numerous lines were down. Due to the various down lines, officers had to close off all of Paso Del Norte and part of the south parking lot of the strip center. Officers maintained the closure until CPS arrived and determined the lines were safe and removed them from the roadway. Officers resumed patrol.

The manager of a local business walked into the Hill Country Village Police Department to report a theft. The manager reported a male walked into the business around 1641 hours (10-02-12) and was looking for a pc television converter. An employee showed him where the converter was located in the store. Around 1647 hours, the manager walked by the area where the male was looking at the converter. The manager noticed a keyboard on the shelf and an open package beneath it. The manager walked to the back to review the security cameras. He saw the male in the security camera open the package and take the converter. When the manager went back to the front, the male had already left the store. The male drove out of the parking lot and into an adjacent parking lot. The male circled around the parking lot before he left. While the male was driving out of the parking lot, one the employee's from took a photo of the license

plate. The manager described the vehicle as a green Honda. The manager also provided the officer with a description of the suspect and a data storage device which had video of the suspect. This case is under investigation.

Offense: Evading Arrest or Detention

While an officer was attempting to make contact with a female who was involved in a crash, the female entered her vehicle and sat in the driver seat. The officer asked her what she was doing and the female said she had to go. The officer told her she could not leave. While talking to the female, the officer noticed the vehicle airbag had been deployed. The female pushed the officer away and tried to close the driver side door. The officer told her again she could not leave. The female again told the officer she needed to go and she again pushed the officer away. While the officer was talking to the female, she drove off with her driver side door open and with the officer still standing right next to the vehicle. The female fled southbound on the US 281 access road. The officer gave pursuit but soon terminated the pursuit for the safety of the general public. The officer went back to the crash scene where he was met by a SAPD officer. While talking to the SAPD officer, it was learned that the female the HCV officer had been pursuing had been involved in another crash on Starcrest Drive. The HCV officer went to that scene and saw that the vehicle the female was driving had been severely damaged. The female was now in the custody of SAPD for Driving While Intoxicated. The HCV police Department will be filing charges on the female for Evading Arrest.
