## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Theft**

**Date: 10.04.15**

**Time: 2351 hours**

**Location: 200 blk Winding Way**

An officer was dispatched for a theft report. Upon arrival the officer made contact with the male complainant who reported that unknown person(s), without his effective consent unlawfully appropriated his amplifier. The male related that earlier this morning he was wrapping up a party at his residence around 0230 when he noticed the amplifier missing. The male said that there were approximately 90 guests at his party and he does not know who took the item; however he is putting together a list for police.

### **Offense: Recovered Stolen Vehicle**

**Date: 10.08.15**

**Time: 0035 hours**

**Location: 14000 blk Mint Trail**

While on patrol, an officer saw a pickup truck with a trailer parked on Mint Trail about 200 feet from Treasure Trail. The trailer was blocking about 60% of the westbound lane. The officer did not find anyone in the vehicle but did see that there was some damage to the interior of the cab. The dash was torn out and the plastic below the steering column was also torn out. There also appeared to be some damage to the ignition. The officer did a computer check and found that both the truck and trailer had been reported stolen on 10-07-15. A second officer came to the location and assisted with photographs and inventory. Evidence was collected at the scene and the truck and trailer were impounded.

**Offense: Possession of Drug Paraphernalia**

**Date: 10.10.15**

**Time: 1307 hours**

**Location: 13400 blk West Avenue**

An officer observed a green Nissan with an expired registration. A computer check of the plate confirmed the expiration date. The officer attempted to catch the vehicle and saw it make a right hand turn onto West Bitters. The officer initiated the emergency lights and followed the vehicle onto West Bitters and followed it as it turned into the parking lot located at the corner of West Bitters and West Ave. The officer was held up entering the parking lot by traffic and as he was able to enter the lot he observed the green Nissan exiting the parking lot, onto West Ave, at what appeared to be a high rate of speed. The officer was able to catch up to the vehicle at West Ave and Embassy Row and the vehicle made a left hand turn onto Embassy Row and came to a stop in a parking lot. Based on the officer's belief that the driver was attempting to evade he immediately detained the male driver. The officer asked the driver if there was anything illegal in the vehicle and he told the officer that he was smoking marijuana in the car with a glass pipe. At that time the front female passenger told the officer that the pipe was in her wallet. The officer observed the female remove a blue and white colored glass smoking pipe from her wallet and she handed it to the officer. The officer was able to observe marijuana residue in the pipe. At that time the officer had the female and the rear passenger exit the vehicle. The officer searched the rear passenger and found no illegal items. The male was searched and the officer found no illegal items. A search of the vehicle was conducted and a small amount of loose and unusable marijuana was located in the passenger floorboard. Based on the fact that the glass pipe was in the female's possession, she was cited for Possession of Narcotic Paraphernalia. The vehicle driver was provided three traffic citations. Based on the fact that none of the occupants had a driver's license, the vehicle was impounded. All three individuals were released at the scene.
