**Offense: Violation of State Vehicle Laws**

An officer observed a vehicle traveling 41 mph in a posted 30 mph zone. The officer stopped the vehicle in the 100 block of South Tower Drive. The driver was asked for his license and insurance. The male driver provided an Occupational Texas License which had expired in March of 2014. The male did not have his insurance card, but stated he could pull it up on his phone. While he was doing this, the officer returned to the patrol car and conducted a computer check on the driver. The return showed that the license number on the Occupational license was the same as his regular license. The driver was found to be driving on a suspended license. The driver contacted his wife, who arrived and picked him up. The vehicle was towed and the driver was issued citations.

A business owner telephoned city hall and requested police assistance for a disturbance at his business. Details of the call indicated a former employee of the business was outside the front door and demanding to be allowed in. Officers responded to the location. Upon arrival, the male was no longer at the location. The owner reported the male had shown up at the business demanding an iPad be returned to him. The owner said the front door to the business is always locked as a safety precaution and when the male wasn't allowed inside, the male began banging on the door glass and screaming at the owner. The owner related the male demanded the item be returned or he would return to the business and get the property one way or another. The male then left the business. The former employee of the business was terminated in May of 2014 and currently under investigation for felony theft.

On Saturday October 18, 2014 at approximately 2135 hours, officers were dispatched to a local car dealership. All exterior doors and windows were secured. The officers resumed patrol.
