## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Burglary of a Habitation**

**Date: 10.13.13**

**Time: 0638 hours**

**Location: 13600 blk Treasure Trail**

While on routine patrol, an officer received a call on the city cell phone from a resident reporting that person(s) unknown had broken into his residence while they were home. The officer responded and contacted the resident. The resident believed the burglary had just occurred. The officer conducted a check of the interior and exterior of the home but was unable to locate any suspects in the area. The resident reported he had gone to sleep at approximately midnight. He had placed his wallet on the breakfast nook counter. Before going upstairs, he noticed that his computer was on the kitchen counter. The resident further stated that he woke at approximately 0530 hours and took a shower. Upon exiting the shower, the resident could hear his dog barking excessively. The resident went downstairs to see what was wrong and immediately noticed that the back door was completely open. When he noticed his wallet and computer were missing, he called police. The officer conducted a secondary check of the exterior and back portion of the property. While at the back of the property, the officer discovered the wallet that was previously thought to be stolen, lying in the grass. Also lying in the grass was a purse. The resident report his wallet contained several credit cards and cash. Only the cash was stolen from the wallet. The officer collected evidence and photographed the crime scene. This case is under investigation.

### **Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle**

**Time: 0531 hours**

**Location: 13600 blk Treasure Trail**

It was discovered that the burglar from the previous entry also burglarized a vehicle at the neighboring property. The burglar was captured on video surveillance. The burglar can be seen going through the interior of the vehicle. A check had been stolen from inside the vehicle. The

burglar appears to be a young, blond male. Evidence was collected and the officer resumed patrol.

**Offense: Theft \$50 - \$1,500**

**Date: 10.16.13**

**Time: 1818 hours**

**Location: 15700 blk San Pedro**

Several lockers at a local gym had been broken into. All of the victims reported they had locked their lockers before leaving the female's locker room. Cash, purses and credit cards were stolen. Some of the victims reported purchases were made at the Macy's department store in North Star Mall. In addition, purchases were made at a local HEB and Walmart located on Jones Maltsberger. The officer contacted loss prevention at Macy's and Walmart and both said they would research the transactions. A short time later the loss prevention employee at Walmart contacted the officer and said they were able to locate surveillance footage of the listed purchases. The officer traveled to the Walmart location and obtained the surveillance footage of the suspect(s). The surveillance footage showed several females entering the Walmart location, shopping, completing transactions, and then departing the location. The female that was most clearly seen in the video appeared to be wearing a blue t-shirt bearing the logo "Pepsi-Cola." The surveillance video showed two females entering a dark in color Ford Mustang. The officer was able to track the vehicle to a local motel. This officer contacted the on duty employee at the motel who told the officer what room the Mustang was registered to. The officer found one of the suspects in the room and she was wearing a blue t-shirt bearing the logo "Pepsi-Cola", which matched the shirt worn by the suspect in the surveillance video. She was read her rights and the officer proceeded to question the female. The female was informed that she was seen at Walmart making purchases with a stolen credit card. Once she knew she was busted, she started to cooperate with the officer. She said a friend had asked for a ride to the gym. While inside the women's locker room, she served as a lookout while her friend broke into the lockers. After leaving with cash and credit cards, the women went on a shopping spree. The woman was arrested and booked into jail. The other suspects is still at large.
