A resident entered city hall to report she had found a backpack near her front steps and also found three debit cards located near her driveway. An officer was dispatched to a Burglary of a Vehicle at a local restaurant. The officer arrived and contacted the male reporting the incident. The male said he had arrived at the restaurant at approximately 1830 hours, to have dinner and to watch a little bit of the baseball game. The male parked his rental vehicle in the overflow parking area located behind a cinderblock wall. After completing his meal, the male returned to his rental vehicle and discovered the rear window, behind the driver's seat, had been broken out. The male immediately looked in the window and discovered that his personal bag containing several items was missing. The male

also stated that he had arrived in San Antonio the day prior, rented the Tahoe from Avis Car Rental and was leaving the following day. The male reported the following items stolen from the vehicle: a computer bag, a company Dell Laptop, a day planner organizer, a black Montblac pencil, \$600 in cash, a book, an I-Phone charger, a Dell Laptop charger and other miscellaneous items. The officer noted an obvious pry mark on the forward portion of the window frame, near the bottom of the window, where a hard item was used to pry against the window to pop the glass outward. No other items were taken from the vehicle. This case is under investigation.
