An officer was dispatched to a grocery store for a Credit Card Abuse report. Dispatch informed the officer that it was linked to a burglary of a vehicle that occurred earlier in HCV. The same complaint was waiting at the grocery store stating that her credit and debit cards were used at that location. The female informed the officer that the bank notified her after she reported her cards stolen, that person(s) unknown attempted to use her credit/bank cards at that grocery store. The officer spoke with the night manager who had dealt with the suspect. The manager stated that she has seen the suspect several times before in the store. The suspect tried to use the cards but he was unable to do so. The manager further stated that the suspect picked up two (2) Visa gift cards and attempted to add \$200 on to each gift card. The suspect was unable to due to the cancellation of the credit/bank cards. He then left the store shortly after trying all the cards he had with him. The manager did not have access to the security video at that time. The manager related that the video could be obtained during normal business hours. This case is under investigation.

Offense: Resisting Arrest

Officers stopped a vehicle for speeding. A computer check showed the driver to have two active warrants. The driver was asked to exit the vehicle but he refused. Officer had to force the driver out of the vehicle and the driver resisted arrest. Officers had to wrestle the driver in order to take him into custody. The driver did this in front of his seven year old daughter who was in the passenger seat. The daughter was released to a responsible adult. The driver was taken to jail and booked for the warrants and resisting arrest.
