Offense: Theft

A business owner telephoned city hall and requested to file a police report regarding an employee whom he discovered had been stealing money from his business. The owner related he discovered some irregularities in his business account and after researching the discrepancies, he discovered it appeared his bookkeeper and accountant appeared to have been embezzling money from the business over a period of more than 3 years. The owner estimated the theft has been ongoing since approximately June of 2012. The owner was scheduled for a meeting with the detective and was informed to bring all documentation he had accumulated since the discovery of the property loss. The driver was arrested for Possession of Marijuana. A computer check showed the driver had warrants and was arrested for that also.
