Offense: Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle

Date: 10.19.14

Time: 2118 hours

Location: 14300 blk San Pedro

An officer entered an empty lot and observed a vehicle parked on top of a hill. The officer activated the emergency lights and called in the stop. The officer approached the vehicle and observed a male and female asleep on the ground, behind the vehicle. The officer made contact and asked for identification which the male provided. It was later learned the identification card provided did not belong to him. The female did not have any identification but provided identifying information to the officer. A computer check revealed the female had a warrant for her arrest. BCSO Dispatch verified the warrant as valid. The female was taken into custody. A check of the license plate through the computer revealed the vehicle had been reported stolen through the City of San Antonio. The stolen vehicle was verified as valid through dispatch. The female was read her Miranda Rights which she acknowledged. The female was asked about the vehicle and stated that she had been driving the vehicle for a couple of days. The female further stated that her mother must have reported the vehicle stolen to get her into trouble. The female had not spoken to her mother in several days. The female further related that she considered herself homeless and was living out of the vehicle. The female did not want to provide any further information and did not seem surprised about the vehicle being reported stolen. While continuing to investigate further, several drivers' licenses belonging to other individuals were discovered inside of a backpack that the female identified as hers. While looking further into the ID initially provided by the male, it was determined that the TX ID card did not belong to him. After further questioning, the male provided his actual name and date of birth. A computer check revealed that the male had two (2) outstanding warrants for his arrest through the City of San Antonio. The San Antonio Magistrate's Office was contacted and verified the warrants as valid. The male was taken into custody. The vehicle operated by the female was inventoried and impounded. Both the male and female were transported and booked at the Magistrate's Office. All licenses belong to others were confiscated as evidence.

Offense: Burglary of a Habitation

Location: 100 blk Cherokee Lane

An officer was dispatched to a residential burglary. The resident reported she had just returned from shopping and had only been gone for about an hour. When she returned home, she saw her back door glass broken and the door slightly ajar. The resident also discovered her front door to be unlocked. The officer cleared the house to ensure there was no one in the house. The resident only noticed two jewelry boxes disturbed in the house. The officer collected evidence at the scene. The resident was given a form to list all stolen property. This case is under investigation.
