## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Welfare Concern**

**Date: 10.29.13**

**Time: 1533 hours**

**Location: 14100 blk San Pedro**

A HCV officer and a HPPD officer were dispatched to a local business for a welfare concern. Details of the call indicated the information was transferred from SAPD through a 311 complaint. The complaint stated a red Ford F-150 pickup had been parked in the parking lot of the business for almost half an hour. The complaint alleges there were children left inside the truck, but the truck had its windows down and was not running. Dispatch related the call was transferred as a possible family disturbance. Upon arrival, the officers checked the area and the vehicle was no longer at the location. The officers resumed patrol.

HPPD officers were dispatched to a family disturbance with a weapon involved. Shortly after the first HPPD officer made contact with the suspect, he had to deploy his Taser to take the suspect into custody. HCV officers arrived at the location and directed traffic around the emergency vehicles. HCV officers resumed patrol when they were no longer needed.

A Bexar County Deputy contacted a female HCV officer and requested assistance with searching a female he had in custody. The HCV officer went to the location, searched the female and did not find any contraband in her pockets or on her person. The Deputy then asked the HCV officer to contact the female's mother who lived in the area and ask her to pick up her daughter's vehicle. The HCV officer did that and then resumed patrol.

**Offense: Possession of Marijuana**

Officers found a suspicious vehicle in the parking lot of a closed business. The officers approached the vehicle and noticed a male in the driver's seat. When the male saw the patrol car, he immediately exited the vehicle and stated "I just came out to eat and get some alone time". The male opened the driver's door to get his identification as requested by officers. When the door was opened, an officer could smell a strong odor of marijuana. The officer began a search of the vehicle and found a zip-lock bag of a dark green leafy substance on the passenger seat and also found drug paraphernalia. The leafy substance tested positive for marijuana. The male's vehicle was impounded and the male was booked into jail.
