## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Suspicious Person**

**Date: 11.02.15**

**Time: 0758 hours**

**Location: 15700 blk San Pedro**

An officer was notified of two subjects in the parking lot of a business soliciting money for gas. Upon arrival, the officer contacted the subject's inside their vehicle. There was a red gas can on the ground outside the car. The male and female admitted to asking the guests for money to buy gas. The officer informed them that this was not allowed and that they would need to depart the location. They told the officer that they would leave as soon as AAA brought them some gas.

### **Offense: Suspicious Vehicle**

An officer was driving through an alley behind a business when you saw a vehicle in the alley. As the officer approached, the vehicle began to pull away. As the vehicle exited the alley way, the officer activated the emergency lights on the patrol vehicle. The operator of the vehicle stopped in the main parking lot of the business. The officer made contact with the female driver who stated she had made a wrong turn into the alley as she was looking for a street that had a house for sale. The female further stated that while she was stopped behind the building, she was trying to pull the location up on her phone application. When she saw a car approaching (the police car), she got nervous and drove off. A computer check was conducted on the driver and vehicle. The female was released from the scene.

**Offense: Emergency Detention**

**Date: 11.04.15**

**Time: 0712 hours**

**Location: 15800 blk San Pedro**

An officer stopped to check out a suspicious female. Upon contact with the female, the officer found her to be agitated and didn't want to speak with the officer. The female provided the officer with her name and date of birth and a computer check returned clear. While conducting the computer check, the female began walking away from the police vehicle. The officer yelled for her to stop and she ignored the officer. The officer ran up to her and grabbed her by her right upper arm, turned her around, and placed her in handcuffs. At that time the female began to attempt to pull away from the officer and spin her body around toward the officer. The officer held her against the side of the patrol car and for back-up. Before backup arrived, the female had calmed down. While the officer spoke to her, she had made several comments that led the officer to believe that she needed psychiatric assistance. The female stated that, "If you put water on the concrete it will explode." She further advised that a vehicle that was driving down the road was going to blow us up. She informed officers that she was a logistics officer in the Air Force; however, she was not active duty, nor a civilian. She repeatedly told the officer that she was out looking for her daughter who she does not have custody of and does not know where she is. Based on the totality of her statements and the fact that she was seen twice in a dangerous location where she could be struck by a vehicle, the officer determined that an emergency detention was necessary to keep the female safe. The female was taken to the closest hospital for psychiatric treatment.
