An officer received a call from a resident who a suspicious male walking in the area that stated he had been involved in a bike accident and requested a ride. The resident said the male did not

appear to be injured and refused to give him a ride. The resident told the officer that the male was last seen on foot heading onto Limestone Creek. Upon arrival to the area the officer observed a male standing on a property on Tomahawk Trail. The male was seen speaking with a resident. As the officer was approaching, the resident waved the officer down. Contact was made with the male who said he was involved in a bicycle accident in the area and was looking for help. The officer saw no obvious signs of a bike accident; however, the male showed the officer his bleeding hip. When asked where his bicycle was he was unable to specify a location. When asked for identification the male said he did not have any on him but he provided his information to the officer. A computer check showed the male had an active warrant out of Galveston County for Driving While License Invalid but that county would not extradite. The male was digging around inside a black backpack and the officer asked the male for permission to look inside the bag. The male consented and handed the bag to the officer. Inside the bag was a black toiletry bag and located inside the bag was a single Fentanyl Transdermal System patch that showed on the package: Rx Only. Nowhere on the package, or inside the backpack, was a prescription for the narcotic. The male said the patch was given to him by his girlfriend. At that time the male was taken into custody for Possession of a Controlled Substance and transported to the HCVPD for paperwork. While at the HCVPD, the male stated he had not been involved in a bike accident but would not reveal why he was on foot in the area and walking onto residential properties. The male said the injury to his side was caused by a stab wound, sustained from his girlfriend several weeks prior. The male said he had gone to a hospital in Texas City, Texas and the doctors did not suture the wound. EMS was requested at the scene and upon arrival they determined the male needed to be seen at a hospital for his injuries. The male was transported to University hospital by a second officer and upon release he would be booked at the San Antonio Magistrates Office. The male was later admitted to the hospital and was booked by proxy and released to a Sheriff's Deputy.
