Calls of Interest

Offense: Disturbance

Date: 11.06.12

Time: 0955 hours

Location: 13700 blk San Pedro

Officers were dispatched to a local business for a disturbance call. Officers arrived and contacted the involved parties. The manager of the business said a customer entered the store and tried to return an item that was no longer on the store's computer system. The customer was told he could not have a refund but they would offer him half price on a similar product. The customer became angry and threw a square across the counter. The customer then walked out of the business. The manager and owner went outside to give the male the square that he threw in the store. The male said he did not want it and threw it toward the business owner, hitting him in the back. The owner did not want to press charges and only wanted the male to leave and never return. The manager verbally told the customer that he was no longer welcome at the business. Officers explained to the customer that if he were to return, he could be arrested for Criminal Trespass. The customer said he understood and departed the parking lot. Officers resumed patrol.

A resident contacted City Hall to report a disturbance at his home. Officers arrived and contacted the female resident at the home. The caller was not on the property at that time. The female told officers the male had left the residence earlier in the morning and had not returned. The female also told officers that they are going through a separation and was unaware of a disturbance call being made at the home. Officers checked the property and found everything to be in order. The officers resumed patrol.

Offense: Disturbance**Date: 11.09.12****Time: 2305 hours****Location: 16500 blk Hidden View**

An officer received a call on the city cell phone from an adult female resident who was crying. She stated that she had been assaulted by her father and requested help. When officers arrived, the female was outside of the residence in the driveway and appeared to be distraught. The female reported her father had been drinking and was angry at her. The female had further stated her father had punched her, slapped her and pulled out large amounts of her hair. The female smelled of alcohol and stated that she had also been drinking beer while inside with her father. Officers did not notice any visible marks, redness or bruises on the female. Officers also did not note any patches of hair missing from her hair and her hair appeared to be in order. An officer made contact with the father, who denied striking his daughter. The father had a heavy odor of alcohol emitting from his breath. He told the officer he was in his room lying down and claimed to be unaware of his daughter calling the police. An officer spoke with his girlfriend who was also in the residence at the time the incident allegedly happened. Both the daughter and girlfriend were asked to provide statement to the assault, both declined, stating they were afraid the male would throw them out of the house. The daughter adamantly refused, stating "he will throw me out of the house and cut me out of the will". Both females became very uncooperative. The female caller stated the following, "I needed help, I'm fine now, you need to leave". Since the female caller was uncooperative and officers had no evidence of a crime, officers felt it was best that the involved parties be separated for the night. An officer suggested to the male that due to the volatile situation and alcohol being involved, he find an alternate place to stay for the evening. The male agreed and was given a courtesy ride to HCVPD to contact a taxi. The male took a taxi and the officers resumed patrol.

A resident called to make a police report on an incident that occurred at her home. The resident told the officer that a male service technician had been at her home and when he was asked to leave the house, the male refused. The resident reported the male became agitated when she refused to pay for additional services she felt she didn't need. The resident said the male did not perform any work at that time and only came out for a follow up. The male told the resident he would not leave until he was paid and also told her that she couldn't make him leave. The resident told the male if he did not leave, she would call the police. The male finally left but the resident was unable to get a license plate number to his truck. The officer resumed patrol.
