Calls of Interest

Offense: Possession of Drug Paraphernalia

Date: 11.10.15

Time: 0328 hours

Location: 11200 blk San Pedro

While en route to the fuel pumps and stopped at an intersection, an officer observed a maroon suburban proceed through the red light at Nakoma and the 11000 block of San Pedro. The officer activated his emergency lights on the patrol vehicle to initiate a traffic stop. The operator stopped the vehicle in the parking lot of the Motel 6, located at 11221 San Pedro. The officer made contact with the female driver and subsequently performed a check of the vehicle. While performing the check, the officer discovered four (4) plastic, used syringes located inside of a makeup pouch belonging to the driver. The officer also discovered a glass smoking pipe located inside of a Styrofoam cup. The driver stated that the pipe and the 4 syringes belonged to her and that she and her female passenger had been using them with narcotics earlier that afternoon. While continuing the check through the vehicle, the officer discovered one (1) plastic, used syringe inside of the purse belonging to the passenger. The passenger confirmed verbally, that the syringe was hers. The listed drug paraphernalia was seized as evidence and photographed. Both females were cited and released.

Offense: Theft

Date: 11.11.15

Time: 0634 hours

Location: 15600 blk San Pedro

An officer responded to a car rental business for a theft report. Once on scene the officer made contact with the manager who reported a vehicle had been stolen from the lot on 11/05/2015 at 0634hrs. The manager said he became aware of the incident after receiving a call from the previous renter who asked for the status of the receipt he had not yet obtained after returning the

vehicle on the evening of 11/04/2015. Not aware of the return, the manager reviewed the surveillance recording on the date in questioned and observed a male retrieve a key from the designated drop box and took the automobile by driving away from the property. The time stamp for the recording stated 11/05/15 at 0734hrs, but it was actually 0634hr due to times savings not being updated. The suspect appeared to be a male; long brown hair tied in a ponytail; slim in build with a tattoo on right shoulder; wearing a white muscle shirt and light gray jeans. Last known direction of travel was towards San Pedro. Once the manager became aware of the theft he reported the incident to the Hill Country Village Police Department. The stolen vehicle is described as a black in color 2015 Chevrolet Sonic. Surveillance video will be available for the Criminal Investigating Department. The vehicle was entered into police computers as stolen.

Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle

Location: 15700 blk San Pedro

An officer was dispatched to the parking lot of a local gym in reference to a vehicle burglary. Details of the call stated the complainant's vehicle was broken into and an item was stolen. Upon arrival, the officer spoke with the complainant. The complainant reported she had parked her white 2010 BMW 325I in the west parking lot next to the building. She parked her vehicle at approximately 0800 hours and walked inside to workout. When she returned at 1000 hours, she noticed her driver's side window broken out and her Samsung cell phone charger missing. The cost to replace the window is approximately \$300.

An officer received a phone call from a resident who reported their mailbox had been broken into sometime between 1600 hours on 11/13/2015 and 0930 hours on 11/14/2015.
