An officer was contacted on the city cell phone concerning a theft at a local gym. The officer made contact with the female caller who with the help of an interpreter was able to relay her

At 6:00 PM she returned to the locker and discovered the locker had been opened and her items were gone. There appeared to be no signs of forced entry to the locker door. The female said she did not wish to prosecute any individual who may have taken her items. She only wanted the report made in case her items were found so they could be returned to her. The female was given the case number and was told that she would be contacted if any of her items were recovered. The officer resumed patrol.

Offense: Possession of Marijuana

Date: 11.15.14

Time: 1359 hours

Location: 14200 blk San Pedro

An officer was running stationary traffic enforcement at the intersection of South Tower Drive and Winding Way. The officer observed a green Honda Accord on South Tower Drive approach the stop sign at Winding Way and fail to come to a complete stop. The vehicle made a right hand turn onto Winding Way and then a right hand turn onto southbound San Pedro. The officer initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle and it came to a stop in the parking lot of a local business. Contact was made with the male driver and sole occupant. The officer told the driver the reason for the traffic stop and requested his driver's license. The driver said he did not have his driver's license in his possession but provided the officer with his information. While speaking with the driver, the officer could detect the odor of marijuana coming from the inside passenger compartment of the vehicle. The officer asked the driver if there was any marijuana in the vehicle and he said there was not. The officer had the driver exit the vehicle and while patting him down he told the officer that there was marijuana under his front passenger seat. The driver said it was half an ounce. The driver was secured in handcuffs and placed in the back seat of the patrol car. Inside the vehicle the officer located a baggie containing a green leafy substance similar to marijuana under the front passenger seat. No other contraband was located inside the vehicle. The driver was cited for the traffic violation and released pending further investigation. Once the suspected marijuana was tested, formal charges would be filed at large.
