## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Wanted Person**

**Date: 11.18.15**

**Time: 1110 hours**

**Location: 100 blk South Tower Drive**

An officer observed a vehicle traveling south on South Tower Drive at a high rate of speed. The radar showed the truck travelling at 47 MPH in a 30 MPH zone. The officer conducted a traffic stop on the pickup truck. The driver stated he did not realize he was driving that fast. The officer asked for his driver's license and insurance card. The driver stated he did not have a driver's license or any type of identification on his person. He verbally gave the officer all his information, including his name, date of birth, and home address. A standard computer check revealed the driver had 9 active traffic warrants from the City of San Antonio. The officer called and confirmed the warrants. The vehicle was impounded and the driver was booked.

**Offense: Theft**

**Location: 15300 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to a theft in progress. The owner of a construction site reported two male suspects had stolen a red cement mixer and several bricks from his construction site. The suspect vehicle was described as a 2002 maroon Chevy Tahoe with a black and white trailer attached. Stolen items were placed in the trailer and the vehicle was last seen heading south on San Pedro. Since the crime had just occurred, the officer positioned his patrol vehicle at the intersection of Bitters and San Pedro waiting for the suspects to drive by. Several minutes had passed and the suspect vehicle had not driven by the officer. The officer notified surrounding agencies to keep an eye out for the suspects. Once contact was made with the owner, he showed the officer a surveillance recording via cell phone of the suspect vehicle leaving the property with stolen items. The owner stated he would be able to download the footage for the

investigators at a later date. The owner said he had returned to the property and found the suspects loading the trailer with the stolen items. When his presence was known, the suspects jumped into the vehicle and fled the scene. The owner made a quick inventory of the property and noticed the suspects had dumped a pile of used tires before loading the trailer. The owner was only able to describe the two male suspects as short. The owner was given a report number for his insurance claim.

**Location: 200 blk Village Circle**

A resident reported that several pieces of jewelry were found to be missing from her home. She suspected the jewelry had to have been stolen within the past three weeks. The resident has not had any service providers or strangers in her home. The officer did not find any signs of forced entry to the home. The officer photographed the scene for investigators.

**Offense: Suspicious Person**

**Location: 15600 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to a local business for a report of an individual, possibly naked, standing outside the location. Upon arrival, contact was made with an employee who reported she was sitting at her desk which faces the exterior windows and when she looked up from her computer, she observed a male subject standing in front of the glass windows, completely naked. The employee described the subject as a male, approximately 5'7" to 5'8" tall, heavy set, late 30's to early 40's, wearing panty hose over his head and white socks and tennis shoes. The employee said after he saw her notice him, the male subject walked off toward another business. The employee got up from her desk and went over to lock the door. The employee told the officer she had noticed a dark colored, 4 door pickup, possibly a Chevrolet, lurking around the parking lot a few minutes earlier and when she went to lock the door, she observed the same truck exit the parking lot onto the access road. The employee did not notice any distinguishing marks or tattoos on the subject, nor was she positive the same truck she observed was the truck the subject was in. Officers checked the area for the truck but it was not found.
