Offense: Burglary of a Building

Date: 11.19.14

Time: 1710 hours

Location: 15800 blk San Pedro

An officer was dispatched to a burglary of building. The officer arrived and made contact with the reporting party. The male said he was making the report for the owner of the storage contents because the owner had to catch a flight leaving San Antonio. To ensure the information obtained was accurate, the officer contacted the owner via cell phone. The owner said he secured the storage unit on 11/18/2014 at approximately 1700hrs. When he returned on 11/19/2014 at approximately 1545hrs, he found his storage unit burglarized. The owner said someone had cut his padlock and stolen several items within his unit. The stolen items were described as; 30 AR magazines (30 round capacity), a green tactical bag (London Bridge Tactical), One Black ballistic vest with plate (no serial number as of yet), military camo tops and bottoms (Mil Cam, OD green), a white microwave (unknown model), and a gun repair tool box. Once the owner completed his inventory, he secured the remaining items in his storage unit with two new padlocks. The officer asked the storage manager to provide video of the property as soon as she could.

An officer was dispatched to a residence in reference to a fire alarm. The officer found the residence unoccupied with no smoke or fire observed. Once the scene was secured the officer cancelled the fire department's response and returned to patrol with no further incident.

Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance

Date: 11.22.14

Time: 0215 hours

Location: 15700 blk San Pedro

An officer stopped a suspicious vehicle and had reason to believe there was a wanted person in the vehicle. When contact was made, the officer immediately detected the odor of marijuana emitting from the open driver's side window. Due to the possible narcotic violation the officer order the driver out of the vehicle and performed a pat down frisk while asking him for his name. The officer asked the driver about the odor of marijuana and he stammered while saying "the only thing I have is a scale". After detaining the driver, the officer ordered the front seat passenger out of the vehicle and began to frisk him. During the outer search of his clothing the officer asked the passenger if he could search his pockets. The passenger consented by saying "yes, you can search me". During the search a plastic bag containing what appeared to be cocaine was located in the front right pocket of the coat he was wearing. The officer asked the passenger what was in the plastic bag. He said "I don't know. We just put some baking powder in it". The officer told the male that it looked like cocaine. The male replied "I don't know what it is, it's not mine". A field test was performed on substance found on the passenger and the test gave a positive reaction to the presence of cocaine. The male was informed he was under arrest for the possession of a control substance and placed into the patrol vehicle. A search of the vehicle revealed a scale with marijuana debris and marijuana debris throughout the vehicles floorboards. No useable amount of marijuana was collected. The driver's recent warrant was identified as a traffic warrant issued by the City of San Antonio. The driver said he has been making payments on the fine and would resolve the matter on the next business day. The driver was released at the scene without further incident. The passenger was booked on the drug charge.
