## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Aggravated Robbery-Attempt/Fail to Stop and Render Aid**

**Date: 11.19.12**

**Time: 1901 hours**

**Location: Limestone Creek**

Two males were involved in an Attempted Aggravated Robbery at a HCV residence. The suspects had jumped the fence to gain access to the property. The suspects were aggressive and attempted to actually gain entry to the house but failed. They fled the scene but were involved in a car crash at Limestone and Tower. One man jumped a fence and ran, but the other was apprehended by police. Their car was also impounded. A team of officers from Hollywood Park, Bexar County and HCV attempted to locate the other man, but he eluded arrest and his exact whereabouts are unknown. The police have good leads and are optimistic the second man will soon be located and arrested.

**Offense: Criminal Mischief \$500-\$1,500**

**Time: 0349 hours**

**Location: 15300 blk San Pedro**

Officers were dispatched to a local restaurant for a burglar alarm. Upon arrival, the rear glass door was found to be shattered. Officers entered and cleared the building. The business owner arrived and went through the restaurant. Nothing was found to be missing. The owner did notice the hasp that was used to secure the electrical box had been pried open. It did not appear like anything had been disturbed within the box. Police photographed and collected evidence at the scene.

**Offense: Suspicious Person**

A resident called the city cell phone to report a suspicious person at the listed intersection. The resident reported a male standing outside of his car and talking on a cell phone. The resident asked him what he was doing, to which he said he was waiting for a friend. The resident asked officers to check on the male. Officers started towards the location provided. In the 100 block of Winding Way, an officer observed a vehicle matching the description, driving with a defective headlight. The officer stopped the car and identified the driver. The driver said he was attempting to deliver tamales to a resident on Tomahawk Trail, but did not have the address and the resident was not answering the phone. A computer check showed the male to be clear. The male was cited for the headlight and released.

**Offense: Burglary of a Residence**

An officer was dispatched to an activated burglar alarm. Upon arrival, the officer could hear a dog barking inside the home as the officer attempted to make contact with the homeowners by ringing the front doorbell. When the officer received no answer, he went to the rear of the house and found one of the rear glass doors broken. Believing the burglars could still be in the home, the officer requested assistance before entry was made. There were no suspects in the home, but it was obvious someone had ransacked the home and had stolen items from the home. Officers photographed the crime scene and collected evidence.
