Offense: Violation of State Vehicle Laws

An officer stopped a vehicle for a defective tail lamp. There was a large three inch hole in the tail lamp cover which allowed white light to emit to the rear of the vehicle. The officer explained the reason for the stop asked for his license and proof of insurance. He provided the officer with an insurance statement and a Texas ID card. The officer asked if he had a license and he stated he did, but it was currently suspended from a DWI arrest. A computer check showed his license was in fact suspended. Since the driver had pulled up to the house where he was working, the officer did not impound the vehicle. The driver was told that he would need to call a licensed driver to pick up the vehicle. The officer will be filing a case on the driver for driving on a suspended license.

Offense: Burglary of a Building

An officer was contacted by a citizen who said on 11-26-2015 at approximately 1500 he discovered that his storage unit had been burglarized. The male said this was the first time he had checked on the unit since approximately 10-15-15 and everything was fine at that time. The male told the officer that on 11-26-2015 he arrived at his storage unit and opened the locked door to discover that numerous items had been taken from his unit. He could clearly see that an unknown individual entering from a neighboring unit had removed the screws in the partition between the two units, pried the panels back, and removed several items from his unit. A search warrant was obtained for the neighboring unit and the victim's property was found in that unit.

A resident came by city hall and stated that a red pickup truck was parked outside of his house when he left the location a few minutes earlier. The couple stated they were inside their vehicle because they were not anticipating the runners for a while and they were trying to stay dry and warm.
