An officer was dispatched to a pawn shop for a debit card abuse report. The officer met with the business owner who reported the following. While in the store, one of the males used a debit card to purchase a Rolex watch and a gold necklace. After the purchase, the individuals departed the store. On 12-11-2015, the owner was contacted by the financial institution that originally issued the debit card and he was told that the individual that used the card in his business was not the authorized card holder and that the card was actually a cloned card. This case is under investigation.
