Offense: Recovered Stolen Property

Date: 12.09.12

Time: 0239 hours

Location: 14000 blk San Pedro

An officer observed two males individuals in the parking lot of a church. Both appeared to be juveniles. The officer made contact with the two males and requested identifying information. Both stated that they did not have any type of ID and gave their names as James King and Tyler King and both provided a date of birth. It was later determined that this information was false and that they commonly use these incorrect names and birth dates as an alias. When asked why they were out so late, male #1 stated that they were from Atlanta, however, male #2 simultaneously stated they were from El Paso, both continued saying they were in town for the holidays and had been staying at a local motel. Male #1 continued to state that they had gotten turned around and lost. When asked where they had been, both males stated they had been shopping for shoes but also contradicted each other as to which stores they had purchased their shoes from. The officer asked if they would allow him to look inside of their backpacks, both consented. Inside of male #2's backpack was a store's anti-theft sensor that had been broken as well as several items of clothing that appeared to be brand new. The shoes that both males wore, showed minor signs of wear and tear, but still had a brand new appearance to them. The officer questioned as to why they had not contacted their parents to pick them up and male #2 showed a cell phone and stated that his battery was dead and couldn't make any calls. The officer requested their parent's name and phone number. Male #1 provided a false number that went to a person in El Paso who did not know either male. It was also later determined that the mother's name provided by the male's was false. The officer contacted the motel which the males said they were staying and the clerk said there wasn't anyone registered by the name provided by the males. The officer decided to transport them to a motel, north of Brook Hollow, where they stated they were staying. The desk clerk did not have anyone registered by the name or in the rooms that the males were providing. When confronted with the reality that they were going to be transported to a juvenile detention center, male #1 provided the correct name and phone

number of their mother. Their mother was contacted and did not know that they were outside of the apartment. The mother told the officer that both juveniles are already on probation for various offenses. The males were transported to their apartment and released into the care and custody of their mother because of their young age. Upon arrival, male #1 stated that all the clothing items and shoes had been stolen from a local department store, near San Pedro and Loop 410 earlier that day. Male #2 handed the I-Phone to the officer and related that the I-Phone had also been stolen, by him, earlier that day. The mother was provided a HCVPD Case number for any future reference she may need. The officer retrieved all the stolen items that the juveniles had in their possession. The recovered items were placed in the property room for safekeeping. This case was forwarded to investigations. The officer resumed patrol.

Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle

A citizen called City Hall to report his vehicle had been burglarized at a local retail store. The officer arrived at the store and saw the driver's side window was completely broken out and there was glass on the ground. The vehicle owner told the officer he had arrived at the store around 1224 hours to buy an item. When he went back to his vehicle around 1233 hours he saw his window had been broken and several items had been stolen. Among the items stolen were a new television, boots, jeans and purses. The officer was able to collect evidence from the scene. The evidence was forwarded to investigations. The officer resumed patrol.
