**Offense: Violation of State Vehicle Laws**

An officer received a dispatch in reference to suspicious person(s) in a local storage facility. The male caller had reported two males with dark clothing and wearing ski masks inside the storage

lot. The male reports they had attempted to approach him as he was going through his storage unit. The male identified himself as a CHL permit holder and twice, instructed the two men to depart. The two men walked around the corner of the storage buildings and disappeared. The male departed the area after the incident. The male described the first suspected male as approximately 6 feet tall and a big "burley" frame. The second person was approximately 6 feet tall and a skinny build. The male could not give any further details due to it being dark and they were about 40 feet from him. The male reported that the skinny individual was carrying, what appeared to be a miniature wooden baseball bat. The caller did not report the incident until he got home. Video footage is being searched for the males.
