## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Suspicious Person**

**Date: 12.17.13**

**Time: 0259 hours**

**Location: 200 blk Hill Country Lane**

Officers were dispatched to a residence for an unknown female banging on the male caller's windows. Officers arrived and could not enter the property because of an improper gate code given by the caller. An officer telephoned the caller and asked him for the correct gate code and he gave the same code. The caller told the officer to go through the walk through gate which did not exist. Officers were able to squeeze through the main gate and were met by the resident. Officers asked the resident about the female pounding on the windows. The resident said she did not call the police. She said the only reason she was awake was because she saw the lights on the police cars. An officer telephoned the caller again and asked him to confirm his address. The caller gave a street name of Country Lane which is located in San Antonio off of Nacogdoches Road. The officer told the caller to hang up and dial 911 for SAPD. The officer informed the dispatcher of the error and she said she would also notify SAPD of the correct address. HCV officers resumed patrol.

**Offense: Wanted Person**

**Location: 1000 blk West Bitters Road**

While on routine patrol, an officer was traveling westbound on West Bitters Road. The officer observed a taxi driving at a high rate of speed in the 500 block of West Bitters. The operator of the taxi abruptly slowed, made a u-turn and stopped in the roadway. The officer turned onto Treasure Trail and came to a stop and observed the taxi make another stop in the middle of W. Bitters road and Treasure Trail, then take off westbound. The officer followed the taxi and initiated a traffic stop in the parking lot of 1005 West Bitters. The officer made contact with the operator of the taxi who related that his driving was erratic due to him looking for the male passenger he had picked up at 555 West Bitters. The passenger looked extremely nervous and

appeared to be trying to place something on the floorboard. As the officer continued to speak to the driver, the passenger would attempt to answer questions for the driver. The passenger was informed by the officer that there have been recent burglaries in the community that is adjacent to where he was picked up and asked the passenger for identification. The male was holding his wallet in his hand and stated that he did not have an ID on him or anything with his name on it, but could provide his information to the officer. The officer requested permission to look in his wallet to which he consented. While looking through the wallet, the officer discovered an old, temporary driver's license with the male's identifying information. The officer conducted a computer check which returned with 3 active arrest warrants issued through Bexar County. The male was detained while the warrants were verified. The taxi driver was allowed to depart. All 3 warrants were confirmed and the male was taken into custody. While searching the male, a valid Texas Identification Card issued to the male was found in his shoe. The male was booked into jail and the officer resumed patrol.

**Location: 14700 blk San Pedro**

Officers were dispatched to a local business for a suicidal male. Upon arrival, SAPD was on scene and had the male detained. HCV took custody of the male who told the officer that his girlfriend had broken up with him earlier in the day and he was thinking about jumping in front of traffic on US 281 N. The male was transported to a hospital where an emergency detention was executed for the well-being of the male. Officers resumed patrol.
