Offense: Theft of a Motor Vehicle

Date: 12.27.15

Time: 2006 hours

Location: 15800 blk San Pedro

An officer was dispatched to a local restaurant for a stolen vehicle report. The officer contacted the male vehicle owner. The owner reported he had gone into the restaurant to order some food. When he returned to his truck, he noticed it was missing. The male said the theft had to have taken place between the hours of 1910 and 2017 hours. The vehicle stolen was a 2004 F-250. The officer had the truck entered into police computers as stolen. There are no suspects at this time.

An officer was dispatched to this area for a suspicious vehicle with a gun involved. Details of the call indicated an anonymous caller reported seeing a dark colored, lifted Ford pickup in the area and the driver was firing shots at deer in the wooded area. A HPPD officer came over to assist. Both officers searched the area but the truck was not found. The HCV officer attempted to contact the caller but the caller did not answer or return the officer's call.

An officer observed a grey car traveling at a high rate of speed. The officer activated the front radar and observed the radar display the vehicle speed at 60 mph in a clearly posted 40 mph zone. The officer stopped the car and identified the male driver. The male provided his license number from Mississippi along with his date of birth. The officer returned to the patrol car and conducted a computer check of the driver's name and date of birth, as well as his license. The license return from Mississippi showed that his license was currently suspended. The driver's name and date of birth revealed a Texas ID card that was clear. Due to the fact that his license was currently suspended, the officer impounded the car. The driver arranged for someone to pick him up. The driver was cited and released.

Offense: Assist other Agency

On the above time and date, northern Bexar County Deputies were responding to a theft of a motorcycle call. The keycard stated that the motorcycle was last seen traveling southbound on US HWY 281 near Stone Oak Parkway. The HCV officer positioned his patrol vehicle in the median in order to observe southbound traffic on US 281. The officer observed a motorcycle matching the description of the stolen motorcycle pass him on the access road at a high rate of speed. The HCV officer followed the motorcycle as it turned onto W. Bitters and then onto Embassy Row. The motorcycle entered the parking lot at the location and pulled into a parking space. At that time, the driver of the motorcycle saw the HCV officer when he activated his emergency lights. While trying to enter the parking lot where the bike was located, the officer was held up by a driver who was blocking the entryway. By the time the officer entered the parking lot, the motorcycle had sped off onto W. Bitters. The officer informed the dispatcher and resumed patrol.
