## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Assist other Agency**

**Date: 12.30.14**

**Time: 1446 hours**

**Location: Bitters Road @ Heimer Road**

While an officer was returning from the fuel pumps, he heard a loud crash. He looked and saw a grey Ford F-150 pickup bounce off a concrete foundation for the traffic control box at the intersection of Bitters Road and Heimer Road. The truck continued on Bitters for approximately 75 feet before stopping in the right lane of traffic. The officer saw the driver exit the truck and walk to the side walk. The officer activated his emergency lights and pulled behind the truck. The officer notified dispatch of the accident and requested SAPD to make the location. As the officer exited his patrol car and approached the driver, he was 20 yards in front of the truck and walking away. The officer called for him to return, but he ignored the officer. The officer yelled to him to return at which point he turned his head back, looked at the officer, and began to walk away at a faster pace. The officer began to run after him as he turned into the parking lot of the adjacent apartment complex. After a few seconds, the officer was able to catch up with the driver and grab him by his jacket. The officer asked why he was walking away and he replied he didn't know, he was very groggy from the accident. The officer had the driver return with him to the accident scene where the officer instructed him to sit on the sidewalk. He had visible red marks on the forehead and said he was not wearing his seat belt. As a result, the officer requested EMS to make the location. The driver was checked out by SAFD, but refused EMS. The officer waited at the location until SAPD units arrived. SAPD took over the scene from there. The HCV officer told SAPD what had transpired. It was later discovered that the license plates on the truck were for a different Ford pickup and the truck was stolen. The HCV officer resumed patrol.

**Offense: Assist other Agency**  
**Date: 01.01.15**  
**Time: 0053 hours**  
**Location: 16100 blk San Pedro**

While on routine patrol, Hollywood Park PD received a dispatch for a Robbery in Progress at a restaurant. BCSO Dispatcher related there were 5 subjects wearing ski masks involved. The HCV officer informed BCSO Dispatcher that he would be responding. Upon arrival, two HPPD patrols units were also arriving on scene. One HPPD officer made contact with restaurant personnel who stated that a customer had relayed information identifying three male subjects standing in the parking lot, as being involved in the robbery. It was later determined that the 3 subjects identified, were not involved and were just in the parking lot changing a tire. HPPD believed that the restaurant personnel may have provided erroneous information as relayed to them by the unidentified customer. The HCV officer stayed on scene as an over watch until no longer needed. HPPD units did not find any evidence or weapons at that time. The HCV officer resumed patrol.

**Offense: Disturbance**  
**Date: 01.02.15**  
**Time: 0948 hours**  
**Location: 100 blk Cherokee Lane**

An officer was dispatched to a residence for a disturbance call. Dispatch stated there was a male calling for police and they could hear a female yelling at him in the background. Upon arrival the officer made contact with a male who denied calling for police assistance and said everything was okay. The officer asked the male if anyone else was inside and he said his wife was. The officer made contact with the female who also denied calling for police and said there were no problems. They did not appear to have any type of injury and their house did not show any obvious signs of a disturbance. No further action was taken at that time. The officer resumed patrol.

**Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle X 2**  
**Date: 01.03.15**  
**Time: 2130 hours**  
**Location: 15800 blk San Pedro**

On Saturday, January 3, 2015 at approximately 2130hrs, an officer was dispatched to a local restaurant in reference to burglary of a vehicle. The officer arrived and contacted the vehicle owners. The reporting parties stated they had arrived at the restaurant at approximately 2045hrs and returned to their vehicle to find it burglarized. The vehicle, described as a 2012 red Dodge pickup. Entry into the vehicle was made by prying the front driver's side window with an object that left two indentions on the window frame. The markings were approximately  $\frac{3}{4}$  of an inch apart. After shattering the front driver's window the suspect(s) entered the vehicle and stole items listed: One black Dell E7440 17" Laptop, three Iphone chargers, Two black jackets, One brown Costa men's glasses, assorted paper work from the vehicle manual book and the male's social

security number. While obtaining the information needed to complete the report, a second victim approached the officer and said her vehicle was burglarized also. The second victim's vehicle was parked two rows back and entry was made by shattering the front passenger's window. While peering into the vehicle, the officer observed a wrench lying by the front passenger's seat. The owner of the vehicle informed the officer that the wrench did not belong to her and was not in the vehicle earlier. After retrieving the item, the officer compared it to the markings found on the first vehicle and noticed the markings matched the wrenches open end ridge. There were no witnesses to the incident or surveillance video available. The wrench was collected as evidence and placed in a secured location within the Hill Country Village Police Department (HCVPD). Information obtained will be given to the HCVPD Criminal Investigation Division (CID). The found wrench was packaged as evidence and given to CID for processing.
