An officer was dispatched to check the welfare of a subject having a possible diabetic episode. Upon checking the area, contact was made with the male at the listed intersection. The male related he had just completed a dialysis treatment 30 minutes ago and he believed his blood sugar level had dropped. SA EMS arrived on scene and treated the male for his low sugar level. Once raised, the male refused transport to a medical facility. Due to his condition, the male was requested by SA EMS and the officer to not drive until he felt better. The officer contacted the male's wife who responded to the location. The truck was parked in the parking lot of the Clock Tower building and secured. The officer stood by with the male until the arrival of his spouse. The officer resumed patrol.

A business manager called the city cell phone to report two individuals on the property had been verbally abusive to her.
