Offense: Suspicious Person/Wanted Person

An officer was conducting a business check and noticed all the power was off in the strip center. An audible alarm was heard coming from a business. The officer called for back-up and proceeded to the alley behind this business. While checking the alley doors, a male was observed walking toward the officer. The officer exited the patrol car and asked the male what he was doing. The male said he was looking for his cell phone. The officer instructed the male to turn and walk toward the wall of the building. The male waved his hand toward the officer and said, "No, I am leaving." The officer ran behind the male on the passenger side of the car and pushed the male onto the hood. The officer instructed the male to lie on the ground, but the male would not comply. The officer took the male to the ground in front of the patrol car at that time. The officer placed the male in hand cuffs and while doing so, notice the butt of a gun in the male's right front pocket. The male began yelling to the officer, "It's just a bb gun; it's just a bb gun." The officer removed the gun from the pocket and completed a pat down of the male. The male was detained in the back of the patrol car. Officers checked the surrounding businesses and all appeared to be in order. There was a strong thunderstorm moving through the area at that time. A computer check was done which revealed one active warrant for the male's arrest. The male was booked for the warrant and the BB gun was entered into the property room.

An officer was dispatched to a Criminal Mischief call at a local business. Upon arrival, the officer was notified that the vehicle owner had already left the parking lot. The officer obtained the contact information for the vehicle owner and contacted her on her cell phone. The woman stated that she had arrived at the athletic center at approximately 1730 and had parked on the east end of the parking lot. As she exited her vehicle, she placed her purse inside the trunk compartment. She did not notice any damage to her vehicle at that time. The female further stated that she returned to her vehicle at approximately 1830, and noticed that person(s) unknown had broken the rear tail lamp, located along the edge of the trunk lid. At that point, the female made contact with the gym personnel to advise them what had occurred. The female stated that the gym personnel showed her a trunk release button located underneath the rear tail lamp. Upon pushing the button, the trunk lid released, allowing access to the trunk compartment. Her purse was still inside of the trunk compartment and she did not notice any other items missing from her vehicle. The female chose not to take the case any further.

An officer was dispatched to a medical office for a forgery report. Upon arrival, contact was made with the receptionist, who advised that the office had received a call from a pharmacy located on Bandera Road. The caller advised that a male had come to the location today, on 05/10/2012 to pick-up a prescription for a narcotic. The pharmacy employee wanted to verify the validity of the prescription. The receptionist checked the files and found that the male had not been a patient at the location since 12/06/2004, and had not been given a prescription for the narcotic. The receptionist checked with the physician, who confirmed that she had not issued a prescription to the male since 2004. It was discovered that the male had passed another forged prescription at a pharmacy on S.E. Military Drive on 05/10/2012. This case is under investigation.
